ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY DUAL ENROLLMENT CLASS POSSIBILITY FOR 20-21 - This year was the first time that we were able to hold a 4 class Electrical Technology pathway where students are able to receive certification from IVC in Electrical Technologies. There is a possibility that we can offer this pathway again next year, but we need to know how many students will be interested. If you are interested, please stop by the Counseling Office before Wednesday to sign up. This is a very small window of time to decision, so please do NOT procrastinate and sign up immediately if you are interested. Thank you!

NEW PATHWAYS FOR 20-21 - Are you interested in a career in Engineering or Biomedical? We will be offering two new introductory classes next year. The engineering course is all hands-on, real-world challenges that students will face. Throughout the program, students step into the varied roles engineers play in our society, discover new career paths and possibilities, and develop engineering knowledge and skills. In addition, as students work in teams to design and test solutions, they're empowered develop in-demand, transportable skills like collaboration, critical thinking, and communication. In the introductory course of the Biomedical Science program, students explore concepts of biology and medicine to determine factors that led to the death of a fictional person. While investigating the case, students examine autopsy reports, investigate medical history, and explore medical treatments that might have prolonged the person's life. The activities and projects introduce students to human physiology, basic biology, medicine, and research processes while allowing them to design their own experiments to solve problems. If you are interested in beginning one of these pathways, sign-up at the Counseling Office window ASAP. An additional course in each pathway will be offered in 21-22. Priority will be given to students who can complete the 2-year pathway before graduation.

The ECEF is currently accepting Scholarship applications. Scholarship amounts are \$500 for enrollment in a Community College/Vocational School, and \$1,000 for enrollment in a four-year University. There is also a \$1,000 Jimmie Cannon Visual and Performing Arts Memorial Scholarship available. Eligibility Requirements are as follows: High School Seniors who plan to attend a University, a Community College or a Technical/Vocational school following high school graduation; Must have a competitive GPA; Must submit unofficial transcripts; Must submit one (1) letter of recommendation; must complete the application form, including the essay response. (Must be a Visual and/or Performing Arts Major – for the Jimmie Cannon Scholarship only.)
