- Game Scheduled for Friday

- Reserved sitting sold out
- “Sales extremely brisk” (Sterner)
- “According to sales records over 300 tickets have been sold” (Davila)

F. SINGLE PLAN of STUDENT ACHEIVEMENT

- **Decease amount of students repeating Algebra 1. Down 10% from 2013 (Sterner)**
- **5% for Algebra 1 and 7% for English Learners**
- **The failure rate for 1st time Algebra 1 students: last year(57%) this year(36%)(Sterner)**
- **Focus of the plan is Algebra 1 and Geometry(Guzman)**
- **62-102 students(Guzman)**
- **Mainly 3 teachers(Guzman)**
- **Things that work: parents ask for intervention for Geometry, got help and passed essential targets(2-4), set up program so that different classrooms focused specifically on individual targets(Guzman)**
- **Students are now understanding the common core and its standards, and there is no overload, taking away paperwork is allowing more instant results, and automatic teleparent set up by the program allows some communication to parents on performance of child(Guzman)**
- **7th period are made up of students with behavioral problems, allowing them to stay in the classroom when the program begins, and the tutors are able to help within the program(Guzman)**
- **In the future, the lack of being able to have the CST and CAHSEE, will prompt the SSC to find a new way to be able to find data on student performance index(Guzman)**
- **Trend in the CST and failure rate: when the D/F's went up, the CST % went down; when the D/F's went down, the CST% went up**
- **Algebra 1 is the top priority, due to the fact that more students attend the program this year than last(Petter)**
- **Suggest that the start of the Algebra program happen within the next week(Petter)**

- Suggest that, if the funding supports it, there would be the firing of one new teacher(Edwards)
- No 9th grade test to determine score index, 11th grade: half will take English and the other half will take a Math(Sterner)
- Change goal #1 of the plan
- District advisor will be on November 20th, and the LEA parent advisory will be discussed @ 351 Ross in the District Boardroom

E. LCFF

- Control weighted towards districts, CUHS not in as much control, waiting to see if funding expanded, right now Sterner negotiating with District about opening spending, target kids with behavior problems, in 7th period, to put them in tutoring(Sterner)
- Hook for teacher; get help to aid with difficult students, Algebra 2 tutoring starting this week(Sterner)
- SSC will have to make decision on intervention program or new program for the future(English) (Sterner)
- Last year for the CAHSEE(Sterner)
- Lots of items in CST not in common core, much more involved in the common core(Sterner)
