- Ι. Call to Order: School Site Council Meeting called to order at 3:34 p.m. by Alicia Apodaca ,Title I Resource Teacher.
- The Pledge of Allegiance
- Welcome/Roll Call: Sign-in Sheet will be used as evidence for attendance. III.
- IV. Approval of Agenda: Mrs. Hernandez moved to approve agenda and second by Mrs. Plancarte
- Approval of Minutes from 01/22/19: Mr. Urguidez moved to approve the minutes of January 22nds meeting and second by Mr. Henderson.
- Link Crew: Mrs. Gonzalez & Mr. Gomez started their presentation on how link crew is doing this year. Link crew is really meant to be a transition program to help the freshman have a warm welcome coming into highschool from Jr. high. It helps the freshman start off with at least 10 new friends and 2 mentors that will help them throughout the year. It aims at getting them excited and into having the school spirit and Spartan Pride we are known for. There are around 50 leaders for 500 freshman, and they get to meet during freshman orientation where they can ask questions and be prepared for the start of school. They have freshman sport support to help bring up a crowd and support our freshman during their games. They are seeking funds from the SPSA where they would like to be able to give out freshman orientation T-shirts which would cost around \$3000; activity supplies such as for a freshman tailgate at their football games which would be around \$2500; Link crew student conference as well as curriculum planning which would be around \$6000; a "Boomerang Project Advanced Training for \$3000. They are asking for around \$17,500 in total which includes what is listed as well as a few other expenses.
- Library Media Center: Mr. Henderson started his report on our library program. (See Historical Library VII. Circulation Semester 1) This year we had our greatest number of books circulated in one semester. He credits the teachers and thanks them for encouraging students to read. Our science collection is very outdated, by about 30 years past the recommended average. That being said, the financial and encouragement to read is much appreciated by Mr. Henderson. Q: Why does Southwest's library have such a higher value?
- A: Money was allocated through Developer Fees and the money was sent to Southwest and Central library was neglected.
- SPSA Expenditure Report Mrs. Apodaca: expenditures listed on SPSA plan are being implemented. After-school tutoring on campus continues with high attendance. In our March meeting, we will discuss current systems in place and make recommendations for continued support and/or adjustments. Our second LCAP meeting will take place February 20, 2019, in the MPR at 6 pm.
- IX. **Principal's Report- Mr. Lyon**: Things are going well with the STEM building. The gym is almost complete and the roll up doors for the snack bar have been implemented; we will start moving things in such as trophies and finishing up. We will hopefully be able to update our library next year.
